Let us be UNITED in our DE COLORES prayer one for the other.

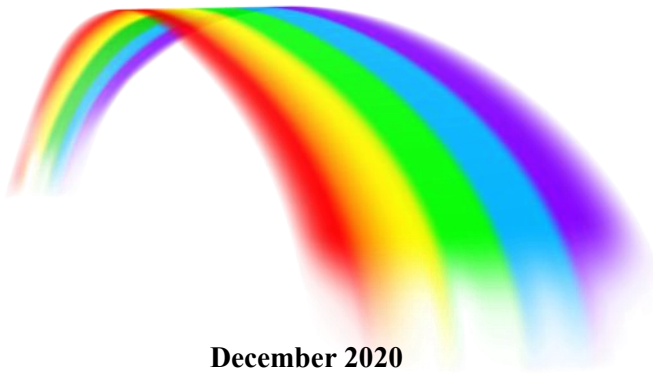

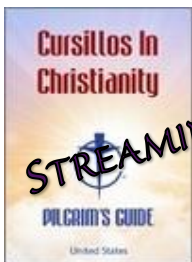

De Colores my Brothers and Sisters in Christ!

I hope that you all had a blessed Thanksgiving holiday. For our family this holiday was a much smaller gathering than in years past, as I'm sure it was for many of you in this age of pandemic. My wife Angela brought out the good china and we made it as festive as possible, although we were limited to just the four of us, including our two children that live in our home every day. Unfortunately, Angie's Dad and brother are suffering with the Corona virus right now, and both of our mothers are at too high a risk to chance visiting with other people. Please pray for them and for all families during these challenging times.

In a way, the longing to see our loved ones that we experienced this Thanksgiving is very similar to the yearning for God that we celebrate during the season of Advent. The psalmist says "Lord, this is the people who long to see your face." (Ps 24:6) Perhaps this Advent, absent of all of the usual frantic shopping and party-going, we can take time to reflect on who we are watching and waiting for. After all, God has revealed His divine face to us in the Incarnate Person of Jesus Christ.

Our heavenly Father makes a gift of Himself through other humans, most especially our Blessed Mother Mary, but also in those humans that we encounter in our lives today. In the musical version of the classic Victor Hugo story of mercy and redemption, *Les Miserables*, Jean Val Jean sings "To love another person is to see the face of God." We are called to see Jesus in everyone that we encounter. The suffering Christ, the compassionate Christ, the Christ who is the personification of the Father's love. In this holiday season especially, we are reminded of our calling to be Christ to others.

As I was out walking in my neighborhood tonight, I happened to come upon a young father packing up the trunk of his car while joking with his little daughter who was acting giddy and silly. As I walked by we made eye contact and smiled at one another with a mutual appreciation of the joys of childhood. At that moment it suddenly occurred to me that neither of us was wearing a mask. As I walked on I wondered when the last time was that I exchanged a smiling glance with a stranger. It may

have been months. Perhaps the greatest sacrifice that we have endured during the Covid-19 pandemic is personal interaction. We miss going to movies and restaurants, but more than anything we miss seeing one another. Maybe that's why Zoom is so popular, because we get a little feeling of joy when we see each other's faces without masks. But there is no substitute for seeing a friend or family member and greeting them with a big smile and a hug.

The Old Testament readings during this season are from the great Advent prophet Isaiah, who lived in a period of history that was in many ways much tougher than ours. The world as he knew it and the nation of Judah was coming apart, yet the prophet continually preached the message to have hope in the Lord, and not in the manifestations of men, political and otherwise. Like the Israelites of Isaiah's time, we also often place our hope in the workings of man in the form of political change, or medical advances. There is a new vaccine arriving soon and we hope that we can trust it to be safe and effective.

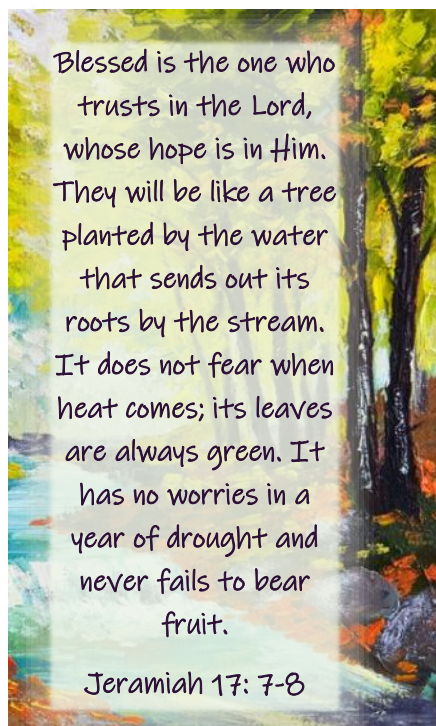
As for me personally, while I wish for the best outcome of human endeavors, the powers of the world all too often thrive on stirring up fear and division. But "God did not give us a spirit of cowardice, but rather a spirit of power and love and self-control." (2 Tim 1:7) I place my complete Faith and hope in God alone. It is through Faith

that we are optimistic that, God willing, we will once again lead new friends to encounter Jesus through the Grace of Cursillo weekends this coming March. I look forward to the day soon when we can all be together and feel the personal touch of God's love through the Holy Spirit and fill a room with smiles.

Please continue to pray for the teams that are starting formation and for potential candidates. Also pray for the new members of our Secretariat who will be officially elected at the December School of Leaders. We place them and all of the Cursillo Movement in the Father's loving hands.

I don't know about anyone else, but I find peace a little hard to come by in this crazy world of 2020. I seem to fluctuate daily between unproductive fear of the invisible virus and my expectant faith in the Unseen God.

As my husband George and I watched TV before the election we muted the commercials if we couldn't forward through them. I unfollowed many social media friends—even if I agreed with them—if their words were venomous. I have pretty much stopped watching the news because it doesn't seem to change. I am not sticking my head in the sand, I am turning off the repetition and trying to find some sanity, something to cling to in the storm. I have been praying that Jesus would quiet the angry waters I have never navigated very well.

At some point, Christ's words in Luke 12 crossed my mind: *"I have not come to bring peace, I have come to divide."* Distressing? Maybe. Then, as God often seems to arrange, understanding of a bit of Scripture I am struggling with comes through in something I hear or read. The next day's Gospel was that very passage. So I took the hint and dug into that reading, searching Catholic resources, and discovered that those words are about an invitation. Christ is inviting us to trust Him. He knows that many will not. He is greatly aware of the pain that will cause them but He won't change the Truth to bring about "peace at all costs." And it won't always be easy for us who follow; in His words immediately prior He tells us, "Much will be required of the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more."

As Cursillistas we have been entrusted with much. We signed our name literally on a dotted line (go look at your Service Sheet!). "I,, from this day on, a conscious and growing member of Your Mystical Body, in union with all apostolic Christians of Your Church, with the help of Your Grace, will contribute my idealism, my self-surrender, my spirit of charity, to make Your Kingdom more

effective in me, and in all those I come in contact with."

I remember sitting in the softly lit, quiet chapel almost 29 years ago, filling out that Service Sheet. When I lived my Cursillo, it was a less obviously divisive world. The



message that came loud and strong to me then is still the same: I am a precious Child of God and I must love others as equally precious Children of God, whether or not they are seeking God or rejecting Him.

I know we will all go through suffering, but I am just enough of a spoiled brat that I expect that my life should continue on the same. Who asked my approval to allow these new challenges: this pandemic and the out-of-control anger in this country? Just when I think I am on an even keel the sea churns harder. So I will mute the noise of the world when I can, but ultimately,

of course, I must face the world and can only do that if I already am in relationship with Him.

Eucharist, prayer, supporting each other in our Group Reunions and at School of Leaders, working together to love and bring Christ to others, caring and praying for those who have been dramatically affected by illness and death, and lifting our hearts to God as much as we can—these things have made the trials easier to bear. Sure, the waves will still try to capsize our boats. The Cursillo community is a shelter against the storm as we pray together: *Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Your Faithful and kindle in us the fire of Your Love.*



Sometime in March, in the "beginning", I heard Fr. Steve Grunow, from Word on Fire, say this: "The Christian vision is not so narrow that we believe that suffering and death are the last word. We have faith that whatever suffering and death we might face, God is with us." Emmanuel!

We have the gift of HOPE: Come, Lord Jesus, come!

- **WHAT IS IT?**

It has been home to the Cursillo for many years due to the vision of the Claretian priests who were caretakers of the Movement in Phoenix in the beginning, the devotion of Msgr. Claret remains our home for future candidates and all Cursillistas.

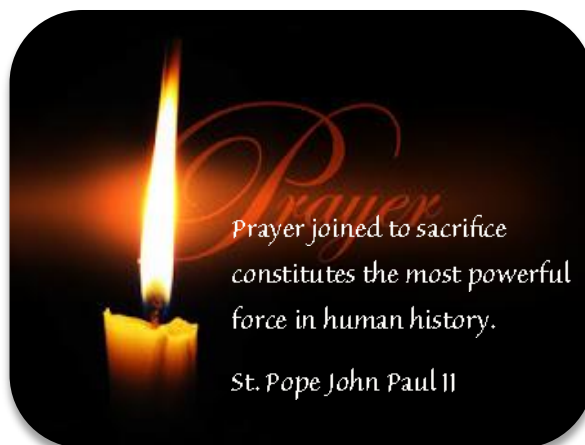
