I will walk by faith and I can do all things through Christ Who strengthens me.

Phoenix Men's English Cursillo #817 took place in early March of 2011 at Mount Claret. The theme song for this Cursillo was: "I Will Walk by Faith." Josef Ratschan was the Rector, assisted by Co-Rectors Ben Ayala and Gene Keller; Fr. Don Kline was the Spiritual Director, assisted by Deacons Colin Campbell and Sione Hola.

Jesse and Rob Yarborough sponsored a young man, named **Dalen Soto**, 28, from Saint Vincent de Paul Parish in Phoenix. What was unusual about this was that Dalen was 100% wheelchair-bound, having been born with muscular dystrophy. He could only use his right hand to control the joystick on his motorized wheelchair. As Jesse explains:

"In Dalen's case, he had never been mobile. To my knowledge, he was born with muscular dystrophy and had never been able to turn his head, much less walk, so when I hung around him long enough to discover how consistently optimistic he was given his state, I was humbled. It was the sort of character trait that would have anyone counting their blessings."

Dalen was fiercely-independent. Using his cell phone, he would arrange his own transportation with Dial-A-Ride and I would regularly see him outside St. Vincent de Paul Church waiting patiently at the handicap parking turnaround area between the Church and the School.

Rain or shine, but usually shine, I would check in with him and ask if he needed any help or assistance, any water, or any shade, and he would always respond: "No, I am fine."

In his late twenties, Dalen had gone through the OCIA in 2008 and was baptized at the Easter Vigil on April 11th, 2009 at Saint Charles Borromeo Parish in Peoria, and Rob was his Godfather. Rob and Jesse had to do just about everything for Dalen on the Cursillo weekend. Dalen was at the Decuria of Saint Paul, led by Tom Gloria and Dave Zeman. By all accounts, it was a very good Cursillo. There were two candidates from St. George in Utah, as well as from many parishes from around the Valley.

I got to know Dalen over time. He was instantly recognizable in his wheelchair. He was always present and always pleasant. I remember distinctly he would show up

for the big Masses at the Cathedral. He would show up at Ordination Mass on the first Saturday of June, as well as the Chrism Mass, and many other important Diocesan liturgical Masses. His response to prayers and blessings was



always about one second behind everybody else. After everybody exclaimed "Amen" there was a pause and then you heard this one squeaky voice shout "AMEN!!"

Dalen was some man for one man. For all that he could not do, he did so much. He was a huge Phoenix Suns fan, and would regularly attend games at the Footprint Center. He would regularly be caught on camera. Bishop Nevares tells me that, while watching TV one evening, he jumped up out of this Lazy-Boy recliner yelling: "Hey, I know that guy! I know that guy!!"

Of course, this included Cursillo #817.

It's a long story, but his exploits also included the Phoenix Comic-Con in May of 2022.

As *Sofia Krusmark* wrote in The Arizona Republic of 28 May, 2022:

A man named Dalen Soto surprised everyone at a Phoenix Comic-Con Fan Fusion panel featuring Jodi Benson, best known as the voice of Ariel in Disney's "The Little Mermaid". Soto, 38, was diagnosed with spinal muscular dystrophy at birth and has been unable to walk for his entire life, he said.

"I can't walk but even though I can't walk here on this Earth, I would like to walk and run, but I know that I believe in God and I will walk someday in heaven," Soto said to Benson during a Q&A session at the panel.

"Your song, 'Part of Your World' has given me strength that one day I'll walk in heaven. I was wondering if there was any way that you can sing a portion of that song?"

He moved Benson to tears, and everyone in the room whipped out their phones.

"I just want to say, Dalen, that you are incredible," Benson responded. "And you are the reason why I do what I do. You give people all around you a purpose and it's such a privilege to have met you. God has a purpose for you."

She ended the panel by singing a portion of "Part of Your World," as Dalen requested.

"This is a song of healing for him," Benson told the gathering. "I hope it's like that for all of you." She finished to a standing ovation.

Cursillista Dalen Soto died in November of 2022, having lived - against all the odds - for 39 years. He was

part of our world for those precious years. Now he has gone to his Heavenly reward, where he will walk in the presence of the Lord. He will also run and skip, go to concerts, sing De Colores while playing the electric guitar, shoot hoops, and play soccer and so much more. He was, and is, and always will be such an inspiration to so many people.

I will leave the last word to Jack Herzfeld, a dear friend of Dalen from Carefeee, AZ:

"One time we went to a concert together and at

the end of the concert it took us a little while to get back to the main concourse of the arena. Dalen really wanted to get a concert T-shirt, but by the time we got back to the main level all the merchandise booths were closed. We then heard from another concertgoer that one may still be open on the other side of the arena. Dalen started speeding down the concourse to get there, going right past the arena staff who were closing the event.

> "They told him to stop because they didn't want anyone going that way, but he just ignored them and kept going full-speed without any hesitation. When I finally caught up to him, he was buying a T-shirt from the last stand that was open.

"I think this small story shows Dalen's outlook on life and personality in the way that he would just get out there and do things without fear and despite his many challenges. He has been a great inspiration to me because he never in the time I knew him let his disability get in the way of living his life and being part of the world around him. I have a similar disability to his and I am often hesitant to do new things and worried about my physical challenges getting in the way.

"Having known Dalen, I now look to his example whenever I am worried about doing something difficult. Whenever I am worried or hesitant, I just say to myself: "What would Dalen do?" and that gives me courage. He was truly an inspiration to me and everyone he knew."

"But our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we also await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ. He will change our lowly body to conform with His glorified Body by the power that enables Him also to bring all things into subjection to Himself." Phillipians 3:20-21 As a postscript, we are putting together an inspirational booklet about the life of Dalen Soto. Application Steps:

Step 1) Make a friend, be a friend, bring a friend to Christ!
Step 2) Sponsor requests application from Parish Rep (or Precursillo Chair).
Step 3) Sponsor and candidate fill out application.
Step 4) Sponsor gives application to Parish Rep (or Precursillo Chair).

Step 5) **Parish Representative** completes application, has Pastor sign it, and delivers it to the Precursillo Chair.

Please note: Sponsors will need an experienced cosponsor to assist if they have never sponsored before or are on the team of that weekend. Generally, a Cursillista should wait one year after their own weekend and be grouping before sponsoring.

movement?" it was through prayer and getting involved wherever I could that I was prompted by the Holy Spirit to apply for the Lay Director.


Below is a brief synopsis of the Chairs: Lay Director - Ensures all duties are fulfilled. Prepares agenda for monthly meetings. Find ways to enhance our movement by coordinating with all chairs.

School of Leaders - Prepares a calendar year syllabus for Cursillo Study. Will determine presenters for the technique talks. Will keep track of attendance for recording in the database.

Three Day - Ensures that all necessary elements core teams and elements will be in place for the weekend. Selects rectors/rectoras and works with rectors/ rectoras to choose co-rector/rectoras. Provides handbooks, guides, and forms to core teams for their use as tools to prepare for the weekend. Works with core teams to ensure they carry on their responsibilities to prepare for team formation and Cursillo weekends. Gathers supplies from inventory and provide them for Cursillo weekends. Facilitate Rector/Rectora Workshops. Present at the Cursillo

orientation and opening. **Postcursillo** - Links School of Leaders and the Ultreyas. Schedules and coordinates the Diocesan Ultreyas. Finds people to present 4th day talk; schedules Spiritual Directors. **Precursillo and Applications** - These two work hand in hand; ensuring applications

are processed. The Precursillo ensures that all Parish Representatives have the



proper training. Distributes information to Parish Representatives to ensure that word gets out about our events. Finds Parish Representatives for those churches that may not have one.

Application Chairs are responsible for reviewing and processing Applications, and attending the Thursday opening night of the Cursillo to register



the candidates and collect fees. The current volunteers would love some help. **Treasurer** - Handles all financial matters for the Movement.

Secretary - Takes minutes for meetings, Secretary will record all attendance turned into them for the School of Leaders.
