Before I made my Cursillo, I
thought I really understood what it meant
to be a Catholic Christian. I'm a cradle
Catholic, my family attended Mass every week,
and I went to Catechism classes on Saturday mornings –
all the way through High School. I knew my prayers,
devotions and novenas. I knew who the Blessed Mother
and the Saints were, and admired their accomplishments.
Altogether, I tried to incorporate all of these things into my
daily life.

After my Cursillo, I realized my faith could be so much deeper. Everything seemed fuller and more purposeful — "colorful". After learning about the principals of Piety, Study and Action, and understanding I needed all 3 to maintain a balanced and growing spiritual life, I came away feeling stronger and more equipped to be, well, holy. I was better able to overcome Satan's desire to rob me of my newfound Cursillo treasures, and his plans to hold me back. I found I had courage to stand up for my faith, to express my faith, and to do little things I would have dreamed of doing, but never actually did. Things like wearing my "Mary" t-shirt to the grocery store, and thinking, "So what-if my scapular is showing?"

Cursillo, and meeting regularly with my grouping

sisters, truly changed my life to be centered on Christ. My relationship with the Blessed Mother grew to be even more loving and personal. Each year I renew my Consecration to Jesus through Mary by St. Louis de Montfort.

Because of this consecration I'm resolved to bring others to a devotion to Mary. I've learned to live my life by trying to see all things as if it were through Mary's eyes. So, when people ask me to pray for them, or need advice, I try to lead them to Our Blessed Mother. I always tell them, "She is lovingly in charge of taking care of us -- and everything else!"

So, with Our Blessed Mother in mind, and as we begin this new year with January 1st being the Feast of the Mother of God, I leave you with the words Our Blessed Mother spoke to St. Juan Diego, "Listen and let it penetrate your heart... do not be troubled or weighed down with grief. 
