How do we announce the birth of a child today? "Send pictures! Send photos!" is the first thing we say when a baby is born and we send and receive photos or videos to each other on our cell phones and tablets.

Usually the first pictures are taken shortly after the birth, still in the hospital. Then, after a while, there's the more formal portrait photos with parents and siblings and grandparents. Yet we want to see the first photo above all.

But God had another way, a different way, a better way to be seen for all who were watching the night sky all over the

world, in the night sky, an amazing sight in the winter sky. What an amazing way to see God at work. Do you remember the **Blood Moon**, the Lunar eclipse, exactly two months ago? It was all over the news, common knowledge and everybody was talking about. I got up in the middle of the night to take photographs. 2023 years ago it was the same. King Herod and everybody had seen The Star. It was a real historical, astronomical event and Herod and everybody knew about it. Have you ever seen something mysterious or strange in the night sky? Most of us have seen something that we can't explain or understand. The Wise Men, or the Magi as they are called, were scholars of the night sky. They knew something remarkable was happening.

"Probably Persian astrologers, they quickly packed up their camels with amazing riches and followed the star that Balaam predicted would rise along with the ruler's

WHAT WAS YOUR SECRETARIAT UP TO IN 2022?

Three Day Chair 2022 Initiatives by Deborah Hernandez

I would like to wish my fellow Cursillistas a blessed new year! This past year was a busy productive time for my position as Three Day Chair on the Secretariat. The Holy Spirit had certainly guided all of us on the Secretariat. I would like to share the progress made and new 2023 goals.

In an effort to cover the most essential aspects leading up to Cursillo core team preparation, team formation, Cursillo weekend activities, and grouping for the New Cursillista, we offered Rector/Rectora Workshops for all Rectors, Rectoras, and Co's. The workshop serves to ensure that leaders of Cursillo weekends are consistent with the guidelines and tools offered to them, such as the Rector/Rectora Handbook, Leaders Manual, and Cursillo Manual. The workshops also foster collaboration between leaders to find ways to use their creativity. We had four workshops between August and November. The participants provided positive feedback so we will

continue to offer the workshops on a consistent basis. I would like to thank Veronica Lucas and Sharon Matson for assisting with the facilitation of the workshops.

One of the most important tools offered to Cursillo Rollo core teams is the Rector/Rectora Handbook. The book provides a summary of guidelines taken from the Leaders Manual and a complete schedule for the weekend. Cursillo leaders use the manual to facilitate the weekend. Due to this important tool, we felt that it needed thorough editing and review to make it more user friendly. We revised the manual in August in time for the November Cursillos and the leaders were able to provide us with feedback to help us further revise the manual. Thanks to Veronica and a special committee who attended evening meetings to review the manual to make this possible.

Other leaders during a Cursillo weekend are the men and women kitchen core teams. Just as a rollo core team uses a manual, the kitchen team relies on a schedule so that their activities coincide with the rollo team activities. We reviewed the daily timings of the kitchen schedule and revised it to match the rollo timings. Veronica revised the schedule in October and the kitchen team used it for the November Cursillos. We received positive feedback on the ease of use of the schedule and will continue to use it as a tool for future Cursillo weekends.

2023 Goals

The following goals will be implemented this year. Please look for email updates and refer to the Cursillo website for further details.

- * Offer Rector/Rectora Workshops throughout 2023 to provide more options for attendees.
- * Focus on ways to communicate how to prepare and present rollos to help rollistas implement new presentation ideas.
- * Assign core teams for Cursillo weekends in a timely manner to ensure teams have time to prepare for all phases of a Cursillo.
- * Hold Cursillos in Flagstaff over the summer.

Funds raised from the Cena De Colores help us to cover the additional expenses from Cursillo Weekends, Ultreyas and other events held at Mt. Claret.

We are in need of Cena De Colores Chairs. The event

is set for April 29th, 2023 at Mt. Claret and it's time for new volunteers to help lead the Cena. My husband Joe and I are willing to train the new chairs so that next year the chairs can completely take over. It would be great if we can have a third person/couple be the Co-Chairs in training so that they can take over in year 3.

Please prayerfully consider chairing this event. We need to begin the planning and working on getting key items for the event taken care of in January!

Other Opportunities to Help

Maybe you aren't called to chair the event, but are interested in chairing one of the following areas.

Silent Auction Chair: Help procure items, log items in auction software, and set up/run auction.

Ticket Sales/Seat Assignment: Handle all tickets sales, donor sales, and table assignments and check in and check out at the event using the software that tracking seats and sales.

Decorating Chair: Decorating all areas of the event; cocktails, auction room, and table arrangements.

Dinner Chairs: Selection of dinner with vendor, setup of dinner services (usually a team of high school students

are available to help serve). Setup of appetizers during cocktail hour. Direct cleanup crew.

Bar Chair: Procuring items for the bar from vendors. Purchase of wine, sodas, and water. Order Mr. Margarita delivery. Procure bar supplies and setup bars; enlist crew to work bar. Obtain liquor license from City of Phoenix (this needs to start in January!)

Security/volunteer parking lot: Hire police security; work with volunteers to help direct guests upon arrival.

PR Chair: Invitations: getting the word out on the event via social media and personal invites. Also work with entire Cena team; reaching out to past donors and table leads/sponsor to donate and/or purchase tables.

Setup crew: Help setup tables, chairs etc. prior to event.

Cleanup crew: Help clean up and pack up items and supplies.

Can't chair? Volunteers are needed to help in any of the areas listed above.

This sounds like a big job and it can be if we don't get enough volunteers to help. But every year it comes together because "God will not let us fail, if we are doing work to bring more people to Him." In the end, it's a lot fun and the feeling you get bringing all of your Cursillo brothers and sisters together for a night of friendship and celebration is a blessing.
