My dear brothers and sisters, I send you Resurrection greetings on behalf of all our Spiritual Directors!



How to Apply for Cursillo Weekend: Sponsors start the

Application procedure. To sponsor a friend, please contact the Parish Rep at your **candidate's parish**. If there is no Parish Rep, please contact the Precursillo Chair: Bart Blaylock, precursillo@phoenixcursillo.com

Please note: Sponsors will need an experienced cosponsor to assist if they have never sponsored before or are on the team of that weekend. Generally, a Cursillista should wait one year after their own weekend and be grouping before sponsoring.

Application Steps:

Step 1) Make a friend, be a friend, bring a friend to Christ! Step 2) **Sponsor requests** application from Parish Rep (or Precursillo Chair).

Step 3) Sponsor and candidate fill out application.

Step 4) Sponsor gives application to Parish Rep (or Precursillo Chair).

Step 5) **Parish Representative** completes application, has Pastor sign it, and delivers it to the Precursillo Chair.

I hope everyone had a blessed Easter Sunday! Did you know that the word "Easter" comes from Old English meaning "East." As we all know the sun rises in east bringing light and warmth; this is a symbol of the rising Christ, Who is our Light of the World. Let us as Cursillistas bring the Light of the World to all those we encounter.

April 7th is Divine Mercy Sunday, Jesus appeared to St. Faustina asking her for a feast celebrating His mercy. God loves us and He wants to give us His mercy each day. He continues to forgive our sins through His Sacrament of Confession. The Scripture has many passages on God's mercy. Let's take a moment and reflect on how we practice mercy in our lives. How is God merciful to us and how are we merciful to others? We may think that being kind and forgiving, founded on our compassion, is merciful. Mercy is different from compassion; mercy is to help anyone in need. In God's eyes, mercy has everything to do with generosity.

As we get ready to celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday, let us reflect on how we can be merciful towards all that we encounter. Begin by showing yourself mercy. Then show a friend mercy. Listen and help them whenever you can. Be patient and kind, don't let our sinfulness get in the way.

Here are a few ways to work on our mercy:

Prayer: I especially love the Divine Mercy Chaplet. I pray this daily and sometimes I pray the Divine Mercy Novena. This is a prayer that we should say often not only for ourselves but for others and different situations. Prayers always help us in our world in the past, present and future. We must be strong prayer warriors.

Action: Be kind - by being kind we should imitate Christ. We should do something for our friends, family, and people we encounter along the road of life. Be selfless, and a good listener. God loves it when we help those that are in need or just need a helping hand. Sometimes it may be difficult to be kind, especially when we are busy and have so much going on in our lives. Does God want us to be this busy? That busy-ness can overrule our environment. Take time to spend time with those people who need us to be with them.



Forgive: We heard about forgiveness all during Lent, which is a beautiful thing. Listening and doing are two different things,

make sure you take the time to forgive but not only in your heart, tell those that have hurt you to forgive them. God wants us to forgive those. I remember one time I went to mass, and it was about forgiveness. As I listened, I thought I don't have anyone to forgive. So, I went and sat in my car and a name came up to me to call that person and forgive

them for whatever I had done. I did and that relationship was able to be healed.

excerpt from the
Dairy of St.
Faustina:

O Most Holy Trinity! As many times as I breathe, as many times as my heart beats, as many times as my blood pulsates through my body, so many thousand times do I want to glorify Your mercy. I want to be completely



transformed into Your mercy and to be your living reflection, O Lord. May the greatest of all divine attributes; that of your unfathomable mercy, pass through my heart and my soul to my neighbor. ... Help me, O Lord, that my heart may be merciful so that I myself may feel all the sufferings of my neighbor. I will refuse my heart to no one. ... May Your mercy, O Lord, rest upon me. You yourself command me to exercise the three degrees of mercy. The first: the act of mercy, of whatever kind. The second: the word of mercy — if I cannot carry out a work of mercy, I will assist by my words. The third: prayer — if I cannot show mercy by deeds or words, I can always do so by prayer. My prayer reaches out even there where I cannot reach out physically. O my Jesus, transform me into Yourself, for you can do all things. (Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska, para 163).
