My term is three years, and one of my main goals is to significantly increase the number of Cursillistas who serve as Parish Representatives.

Why is a Cursillo

Representative important to have at each Parish? As shared in the Leaders talk, one of our main calls as Cursillistas is to make a friend, be a friend, and bring a friend to Christ. A Representative who is a member of the individual Parish is in the best position to observe parishioners who are leaders, and make those friends. It's not simply a funnel for candidates, as the Movement is focused on quality over quantity.

Parish Representative's serve as the main point of contact for their parish when a candidate is identified, assist with securing a sponsor if one isn't associated, and assist the candidate/sponsor with their application. This includes obtaining a signature from the Pastor, and submitting the completed application to the Applications Chair of the Secretariat.

Additionally, Parish Reps are encouraged to promote Cursillo as much as possible. These options are not required, but presented as ideas:

- ⇒ Hosting a Cursillo table/booth at the Parish Ministry Fair to provide information to those interested in Cursillo
- ⇒ Placing bulletin announcements that promote Cursillo and invite Cursillistas in your parish to connect
- ⇒ Hosting an Ultreya at your parish
- ⇒ Making a friend, being a friend, and bringing that

friend to Christ!



Another fruitful effort is to connect with Parish Representatives from neighboring parishes to collaborate on regional outreach efforts, including regional Ultreyas co-hosted by several local parishes. At some point, we'll look to create "regions" within the Diocese that align parishes into geographic communities of faith that offer parish rep training, resources, and support from the Secretariat.

However, the first order of business is to secure faithful volunteers to serve as Parish Representatives to be local ambassadors for the Cursillo Movement in the Diocese of Phoenix. 
