

(I will continue my ministry as database manager and with weekend needs.)

I've always loved the start of a New Year. I'm not a huge one for resolutions, but I do like the fresh slate a new year represents. In taking an honest look at the state of my piety, study, and action over the last year let me share a few of the highlights, the truth about where I'd like to grow, and my renewed commitment to living my 4th Day as fully as I can.

Piety – One of my favorite parts of each week is the hour I've committed to spending in Adoration. No matter what's going on in my life or what's on my mind, I always leave Adoration better off than when I entered. Sometimes I'm laser-focused and sometimes I beat myself up for how many times my mind wanders off, but my time spent in Adoration is always, always time well spent. In looking at my piety, I also love that it's become a habit to have ongoing conversation with God throughout the day. It's like chatting with a friend. But if I'm honest, one part of this that is lacking is an intentional morning offering and intentional evening examination of conscience each day. Although I love walking with God throughout the day as my friend, I'm often resistant to let Him take the lead. I am recommitting to adding these touchpoints of prayer to start and end my day and surrendering my day to him as my Guide, not just as my companion.

Study – This is admittedly the weakest leg of my tripod. I listen to several Catholic podcasts pretty regularly and I've gotten pretty good about stopping to research an answer when a faith question occurs to me. At one point this past year I even took a pretty deep dive into better understanding intercessory prayer. But, my study is sporadic and certainly not disciplined. One thing I'm committing to doing this new year is learning more about the saints. It's been several years since I've picked a saint for the year to learn about and pray to. I found a random saint name generator online and I chose St. Faustina

(or rather, she chose me) to study this year.

Action – I had a cool experience on the final day of 2021. I was flying from Iowa back to Arizona after visiting my parents. I'm a very nervous flyer and my coping strategy for airplanes usually involves going into my 'zone' and not talking with


anyone. This travel day was an especially tough one – filled with overbooked flights, mechanical problems, and a winter storm. I was an anxious mess.

After sitting on my airplane for nearly two hours waiting to see if we'd take off or not, having barely said a word to the people around me, we finally deplaned. I was now forced to wait out five more hours of a delay in hopes of making it out on the last flight of the night. I walked into the only restaurant open in the airport and the woman who had been sitting next to me on the flight invited me to sit down at the table she'd managed to find. I did. And then something amazing happened.

We started to talk. We'd been perfect strangers just hours before and I barely acknowledged her existence sitting shoulder to shoulder for two hours, but when we finally connected the Holy Spirit went to work. Over the next several hours we shared all about our lives. We were both vulnerable and honest. My new airplane friend was returning home after coming to Iowa to bury her father and before I knew it we were crying together as she shared her grief with me. I listened and comforted her, but mainly just gave her space to say all the things she needed to say out loud. And in all of it, the Holy Spirit was so very present. She thanked me for being a new year's blessing to her, but honestly, I was just as thankful for the blessing she was to me. What a perfect reminder for me of the power there is in being truly present with someone. Make a friend, be a friend, bring a friend to Christ. It happens in those raw, vulnerable moments. And I'm committed to continuing to open my eyes and my heart for opportunities to be present like this as I head into the new year.

So there you have it ... my continued commitment to growing in my piety, study and action. So here I go, charging into the new year with God not only as my friend but as my guide, with the intercession of St. Faustina, and with a desire to be truly present with people. 2022. Let's do this!

EASY TITHE

- *First, we would like to thank all of you who are currently enrolled with Easy Tithe. Your continued support of the Cursillo Movement is greatly appreciated.* (If your card has changed or expired, please take a minute to go to www.Easytithe.com/Cursillo and update/)

- **WHAT IS IT?**

A low cost monthly auto withdrawal from your bank account directly to the Cursillo Movement to help pay for operating expenses of the Movement (i.e., rent, supplies, stipends and scholarships). You choose the amount you'd like to contribute, when, and how often.

- **WHY?**

○ A major goal of Cursillo is to allow every qualified candidate to live their weekend. The cost of the weekend should never keep someone away. The actual cost to put a candidate through the weekend is in excess of \$350 per person. However, we strive to maintain the stipend at \$150 per candidate. To accomplish this goal requires fundraising, including our Easy Tithe program.

○ While Cursillo weekends can be held almost anywhere, we are truly blessed to call the beautiful, holy ground that is Mt. Claret Retreat Center, "home". It has been home to the Cursillo for many years due to the vision of the Claretian priests who were caretakers of the Movement in Phoenix in the beginning, the devotion of Msgr. McMahon, and the love, time, and talent of many Cursillistas over the years. Support through Easy Tithe assists in ensuring that Mt. Claret remains our home for future candidates and all Cursillistas.


