FROM THE LAY DIRECTOR

Greetings, Cursillo Community!

As we wind down on another school year, let us lift up in prayer all those dedicated teachers who are walking out for just pay. We ask the Lord for justice where there is none, and His Mercy on all who are in need of it. We also ask for your palanca for the two Cursillos in May, Men's Cursillo # 911 May 3-6, and Women's Cursillo # 912 May 17-20.

This past April 24th, Jo-Ann and I along with several other members of the Cursillo, Engaged Encounter and the Franciscan Friars of the Holy Spirit communities were present for the Spring Appreciation Social in the Mt. Claret Conference Center. Donors had the opportunity to listen to presentations from the different ministries that call Mt Claret home, including our Cursillo Movement. Sharon Matson did an outstanding job of recalling the roots of Cursillo at Mt. Claret for the past 50 years, and the impact of Cursillo in the lives of thousands that have lived their Cursillo at Mt. Claret, and what the Mt. Claret means to us.

Listening to the history and the growth of Mt. Claret, I recalled all the experiences I had in working teams before any of the renovations initiated by Monsignor McMahon in the 90's. The team bunked upstairs above the Rollo Room, while the candidates slept where the team now sleeps, on the north side of the Ultreyas. The dining room was where the lobby is now. The space was so tight that at introductions, the chairs were back to back, and only one person could stand to introduce themselves, while the others made sure their chair was pushed in as much as possible. Mañanitas were held in the Rollo Room instead of the Chapel, and the room had to be broken down after the Leaders Rollo on Saturday night, which sometimes did not end until

11:30 p.m. I remember going down to help paint the newly stuccoed exterior with my group friend Ken McGovern when the renovation began around 1993, under the watchful eye of Monsignor. He kept telling us to repaint some spots that he thought we missed (They were only the shadows cast by the sun).

After the ministries finished their presentations, Tom McGuire, the manager of Mt. Claret showed two plans that are just in the preliminary phase that involve updating the heart of Mt. Claret: the Chapel. They include some modernizing and aesthetics in the interior, while giving the exterior a southwestern mission look. One plan includes a narthex at the entrance to help eliminate distractions from those who may come a little late to the service. There is also a plan to renovate the north side Ultreyas where the teams stay. These dorms have never been updated before, and this plan may bring a "Yahoo!" from many Cursillista team members. Included in this plan is a lobby in the room that was closest to the bathrooms. Nice idea if I do say so!

Mt. Claret has been a blessing to thousands of pilgrims who stay there, and it has always been a place where Christ is met in a personal way. Let us try to support these endeavors for renovation in any way we can, financially, and prayerfully. To many, including myself, it is that "Happy Place" that we go to-like on *Happy Gilmore*!

Witness of Piety - Study - Action

When asked to contribute to this newsletter, my initial thought was "I have nothing of value to say". But I pushed that negative thought away, as it comes from the evil one. Instead, I will write about my ongoing conversion as it relates to the Christian life I strive to lead.

It has been a 28 year journey for me. In truth, it began when I sought help for my alcoholism and drug addiction. In April of 1990, after a 30 day rehab stay, I came out hopeful to begin a new life. I had to die to my old way of life so that the new life could form, grow and blossom. St. Mother Theresa of Calcutta said "anything that takes you away from Christ must be removed." I had to change everything. I could no longer rely or trust on my own way of thinking, I had to trust in the Holy Spirit to guide me. I had to decrease so that Christ could increase within me. I returned to the Church of my youth, as I had been raised in the Catholic faith, sent to Catholic schools and had believed until I started down that long dark road of addiction. I found comfort in confession, a releasing of the heavy burden of sin! I began receiving the precious Body and Blood. I found I was enthused and that "fire" returned in my heart for God. I worked on attaining forgiveness and rebuilding of trust and relationships.

In 2005 I received the gift of attending my Cursillo! It affirmed what I had been striving to do since early sobriety, as well as what I still needed to do. My journey is still being written, as I have so much more to learn from my faith community and my fellow Cursillistas - if I stay open to being teachable, and follow the example of those who walk the walk and put that faith into action.

Each Friday morning, Marty and I get to spend from

3am to 4am with Jesus in the Adoration Chapel at our parish. This has been our schedule for the last seven years, and we made the commitment to not go back to bed after we get

home, but to give of our substance (sleep) as a sacrifice to God. I'll be honest – when Marty first suggested this, I thought he was crazy! Wasn't getting up at 2:30am to be there at 3 enough? But as I soon found out, all you have to do is ask Jesus that He give you just what you need for the day and

the tasks ahead, and you receive it!

I have learned many lessons and received answers to problems I have given over to Christ while in the quiet of Adoration. It has given me that quiet hour to study scripture that has helped me move in the direction I pray Christ wants me to go. I believe being involved and staying active within the Cursillo Movement can only strengthen my journey towards one day being crowned a saint in heaven. Isn't that what we're all striving for?


