


Greetings, Cursillistas!

I recently went to the Diocesan Ultreya at Mt. Claret, and it was a great time of fellowship and sharing. I was asked to do one of the witness talks, and I shared my initial conversion when I made my Cursillo. I have shared this story a handful of times over the past thirty some years, and yet the Holy Spirit revealed something to me about my conversion that I had never thought of before.

My point is we can never stop learning about ourselves, because God in His wisdom will reveal it to us when the time comes.

Witness of Piety - Study - Action

Jesus told His followers (Matthew 5:14-16) to "let your light shine before others," calling them to live an active faith.

Our circumstances are an opportunity to shine brightly for the Lord and to share God's overcoming truth with those around us. Our family and community can tell what we believe by how we live!

Isn't this what we are taught on our Cursillo weekend? Easier said than done, right? And persevering is one of the things I've learned (and am still learning) to help me live my life of Piety, Study and Action.

I don't think I understood the word perseverance, or what it meant even after I made my Cursillo in the early 80's. I was 19 years old at the time and having a great time being young and single! But after my weekend, I knew it was time to start walking the talk if I was going to

be a light to others. I had the tools to help me start.

When I started working Cursillos in 1985, every team I worked, I felt like these women were soooo holy!! I kept thinking, "How can these women pray so much!? Mass during the week other than Sunday? I could NEVER do that! All these struggles they go through in life. How can they be so faithful and joyful even during hard times?" But as I got older, every time I said yes to God, whether it was working Cursillo, grouping, or even just sharing my faith with others, He would give me that grace and reveal Himself a little more; especially during the struggles I encountered in my life. It was like a veil being removed each time, and I was able to understand a tiny bit more. I also realized that I was learning who God was, but I didn't really know that LOVE for Him. So I had to work on my Piety. And because I wanted to learn to love this God, (for

me) going to daily mass was one of the answers.

(Piety) I know after I began going to daily mass, I really felt that closeness and awareness with Jesus. It was such a wonderful peaceful feeling and I was receiving His body and blood daily; spiritual nourishment to help me through the day.

(Study) I was also learning about my God through the daily scriptures that were being read every day. How wonderful to be able to hear Him speaking to me through Scripture (which He did MANY times).

(Action) It became normal to spread that love for God and try to be that light to others in my daily life.

I realized persevering isn't just doing this when I "feel" like it or just when it's easy to do because I feel the Holy Spirit moving within. No. It's persevering when I DON'T want to do these things. And believe me, there are times when I don't feel anything!

But, you know what? That's ok! I know that I am human – I'm not perfect! But I know I have to continue on my journey no matter how I "feel". I need to be obedient! I think of some of the great saints who suffered the "dark night of the soul" and continued in obedience to serve Our Lord and serving others. What great examples!

Some of the things I use to help me are:

Daily mass - It's not going to be easy, but it's worth it. And if you want to get to know and love Him, do it. If not every day, start once during the week. Then twice if you can! I'm challenging you!

Eucharist - We want to become what we receive - Pope Leo said, "Turn us in to what we are receiving" That's Jesus! Just like our bodies need food for nourishment. Our souls need the Eucharist for Spiritual nourishment.

Rosary - That's always been a struggle for me but I've learned that I don't have to say it all in one shot. All throughout the day, I can pray my rosary. The rosary helps me reach a deeper understanding of Jesus' life. I know His mother is right there, gently and lovingly helping me along the way.

Adoration: Healing (like an invisible force) radiates from Adoration. Let whatever healing that is needed in our lives begin by going to Adoration – even if it's for a minute to visit Our Lord! I'm still learning how to spend time with Jesus and even if I don't understand, I trust He is there. I think if I really understood the miracle and Presence of Our Lord being right there, I would stay and adore Him 24-7. I would never want to leave (would you?) I think God knew that too! He wants me to believe by blind faith, and allow me to not fully comprehend the greatness of Him being there, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity.

So wherever we're at right now - that is where we begin. And it begins WITHIN. I had to begin with myself. I was so busy trying to change my husband, change my friends, change everyone at work, etc. that I had to step back and start with ME. Then, and only then, could I begin to see what I could do with my environment, beginning in my home. By loving my husband unconditionally and without judgement. By loving my family and friends, even if I didn't agree with them (and even when I was right – which was a lot...lol). Everything to be done with love.

Again, grouping with others is so important to keep me going. There are times, when I don't want to go - I'll admit! But, when I do go, Jesus' presence always comes to light. Whether it's a meditation or a song or maybe even

someone else just sharing their struggle, it always puts me back on track! My Christian Community always comes through (where two or more...).

So as I continue to persevere each day in my Piety, Study and Action, I ask God to let MY light shine wherever I am! I still say the prayer my father gave me many years ago (**Radiating Christ** by Blessed John Henry Cardinal Newman). It was one of St. Teresa of Calcutta's favorite prayers too, so I guess I'm on the right track!


