in preparation for the 60th anniversary of Arizona's Cursillo #1, which took place in November of 1959.

Now we have come through a spring and summer like no other, through lockdowns and reopening phases, masks, social-distancing and hand-sanitizer and on and on it goes. We do not know when we will once again be able to hold Cursillo weekends. We have more time for each other, but through virtual meetings and communication.

I was commenting to someone just the other day that it seems like only recently they were trying to pass laws against Muslim women wearing face coverings in public - and now you will be chastised or worse for not wearing a face mask in public or in Church!

God certainly has a sense of humor... these are strange times indeed ....

As we move through August, we see Jesus living in a strange time also. It was the best and the worst of times for Jesus: it was a time of heightened emotion because He was at the peak of his popularity and yet had seen how He was

not getting through to the followers and had radically changed how He taught, choosing instead to teach with parables, explaining all about the Kingdom of God.

Then Jesus' cousin, John the Baptist, was arrested by King Herod. Jesus then went to His home place of Nazareth and was rejected, possibly out of fear of

Herod. On returning to the Sea of Galilee, He heard of the murder of John.

Everything was going wrong and yet Jesus was still hugely popular with the people. Grief-stricken and rejected, feeling the need for some peace and solitude, Jesus left Capernaum by boat and arrived at a place called Tabgha, a deserted grassy cove on the lake shore, where

> no doubt He wanted time alone to think about and figure out all that was going on.

You can't always get what you want! A vast crowd followed Him, many walking along the shore in the late afternoon. Hanging on His every word, inspired by His authority, witnesses to His miracles, they still wanted more. He was moved with pity for them, cured the sick... and still they wanted more. They wanted to be loved and now they also needed food.

But Jesus knew that God loves a dire situation in order to prove Who God is and

how powerful God is. He combines words and action, combines love and food. Just as at the miracle at Cana when he asked the wedding attendants and stewards to help turn water into wine, He decided to let the disciples play a part in this miraculous meal for thousands and thousands.

We see just how Jesus' disciples get their welldeserved reward. In the Eucharist above all, He gives us the food that satisfies for eternal life. We are all called to

> take an active part in this life of Christ and in the generosity of God.

I hope that you are all well and finding ways to stay out of the heat. My wife Angie and I recently went on a camping trip on the Mogollon Rim to enjoy the cooler

temperatures, and as we drove I was struck with awe by the size of the burn scar caused by the recent wildfires. The "Bush Fire" raged on for three weeks from June 13 to July 6<sup>th</sup>

and burned 193,444 acres, or over 300 square miles. The Beeline Highway has always been a favorite drive, with changing landscapes moving from the desert Saguaros to high mountain forest. The landscape now stands as a testimony to the contrast of the devastating power and sheer beauty of nature. From just past Mesa all the way to Rye just south of Payson, on the east side of the road, entire mountainsides are covered with ash and the blackened remains of leafless trees resembling the remnants of a nuclear Armageddon. The west side of the road however, is a picturesque montage of varying colors of grass, brush and trees. As we were driving down the mountain headed for home with a clear vision of destruction and death to the left, and beauty and life to the right, it occurred to me that incredibly the forest will eventually regenerate and be restored to new life. Nature and its ability for rejuvenation stands like a beacon of light as a constant reminder and witness to the awesome power and grace of God.

A day or so later I was meditating on how the wildfire relates to the current social climate in our world and nation, and specifically on the recent attacks on the Catholic Church. These are trying times for Catholics and it can seem like the world is going up in smoke around us. We have to wonder how anyone can hate the Church, who has championed the cause of social justice, and been the strongest advocate for the dignity of each and every human person. The answer must be that they simply do not know Christ. To the misinformed, even some who were raised as Christians but do not practice religion, the Church is viewed as an institution and perhaps a symbol of oppression. But for those like us who have been enlightened by Faith, we know that the Church is not a mere building or institution, but that we are the Church,

the living Body of Christ in the world. We should take these attacks personally, because they are anarchistic personal assaults on God himself, and on us as members of His Body. Each torch thrown at a church, or scathing anti-Christian editorial and meme, echo the cries of a mob 2000 years ago shouting "Crucify Him!" So how do we in our fallen



nature, prone to anger and frustration, deal with this? Are we capable of responding with the love and mercy of Christ when He said, "Forgive them Father, for they know not what they do?"

How can those who are estranged from faith, come to know the Catholic Church for who She really is? The Magisterium can release statements reflecting the Catholic stance on social justice all day long, but unfortunately they are largely preaching to the choir. In this day of selective newsfeeds geared towards a targeted audience, those outside the Catholic Church simply aren't listening. I believe that it's up to us, the laity in the trenches, to show Christ to those who have strayed far from Him. A few weeks ago some of us gathered for a

memorial mass to honor our Cursillo brother Art Broulliard who has entered his fifth day and has gone on to be with the Lord. If you knew Art, you couldn't help but be inspired by his example and see him as the face of Christ. When Haiti was all but destroyed by an earthquake in 2010, the Holy Spirit moved Art to found a charitable organization, Action by Christians (ABC) For Haiti, and he brought aid to the children of one of the poorest nations on earth for nearly 10 years, until he was no longer able to due to his failing health. This may seem like a big thing to undertake, but I'm certain that Art didn't see it that way. He probably saw it as, to paraphrase Saint Therese, a little thing done with great love.

Cursillo doesn't work though grand speeches and big

gestures. Cursillo is about a personal encounter with Christ. If we are to change the world for the better it will be by allowing those in our environments to be influenced by a personal encounter with the Christ in us. We have the ability and have been provided the tools to do this by
