FROM THE LAY DIRECTOR

SHARE YOUR JOY!

In the movie *The Bucket List* there's a scene at the Great Pyramids where Morgan Freeman asks Jack Nicholson the two questions the Egyptians required to enter into Heaven. The first question is "Have you found joy in your life?" The second question is similar, "Have you brought joy to others?" As Catholics, at the end of every mass we are sent to proclaim the Gospel, "The Good News". Pope Francis thought that the joyful expression of God's love was so important that he started his first apostolic exhortation with the words: "The joy of the gospel fills the hearts and lives of all who encounter Jesus." Saint Paul, in his letter to the Philippians tells us to "Rejoice in the Lord always. Again I say Rejoice!" And Bishop Olmsted titled his recent exhortation on the family: "Complete My Joy". It would seem that Joy is a pretty important aspect of being Christian.



In this Sunday's Gospel reading from the Luke, Chapter One I was struck by a strange Greek word, "Theophilus". I'd heard the word before in the beginning of the Acts of the Apostles, and I

wondered what it meant. I had to look it up and it turns out that Saint Luke, inspired by the Holy Spirit, addresses both of his great literary works to us as "Friends of God". I was greatly pleased with this thought and a song lyric immediately came to mind. "I am a friend of God; He calls me friend!" Now this is call for great joy! One of the greatest fruits of the Cursillo movement is the great relationships that we build, especially with Our Lord, but in a significant way with the friendships we make within our Cursillo community.

My wife Angie and I have been blessed in our fourth day to see that fruit continually blossom through bonds of friendship that we enjoy. Just Saturday night we had a wonderful evening with our dear friends Freddie and Maritza, who we first met on our Cursillo weekends 10 years ago. Then on Sunday morning after mass we gathered in the vestibule of the Church with all of our group brothers and sisters and their families; smiling and genuinely happy to be together in God's house. I wonder what the unknowing members of the congregation must think when they see this large group of about 16 people, including children, joyfully conversing and hugging one another like one big happy family. Perhaps they were moved like the pagans who remarked of Christians in the early Church: "See how they love one another."

Piety - Study - Action

I don't do well with resolutions. I figure they're just one more opportunity for me to disappoint myself for an entire year. However, I do believe in goals. In my job in the schools, I work with those all the time. So, when the new year came up and I felt I needed to challenge myself spiritually, I wrote a goal.

The first place to start with a goal is to define the weakness. With so many to choose from it was tough to pick just one. I chose the weakness that sometimes I don't witness when I have the opening. I spend too much time



in my own head... "is this the right time... will I say this correctly...do I even know what I'm talking about?" By the time I dither around long enough, the chance has passed, and the moment becomes something to recollect at the next Confiteor "the things I have failed to do."

So, I wrote myself a goal. It reads: For 6 weeks Nancy will share her faith

when prompted to do so 9/10 times. Within a week, I received a call from Cecelia Dusold to witness at the St. Helen's Ultreya. My head started its destructive whirling: "What could you possibly witness about ... don't you have something better to do on Saturday? Someone else will do so much better..." and then I answered Cecelia, "Yes." 1/1 times toward my goal. (Ed. Note: Nancy, you can count this article as another one! CD)

Shortly afterwards, I received a call from our youth director. Richard, my husband, who is a deacon at our parish, was scheduled for a question and answer session on the morning of their retreat, and she would like me to accompany him. We would need to be there at 6:30am on a Saturday. Deep breath, "Yes, I would love to." 2/2 times

When we arrived, the kids asked typical questions of Richard, how he became a deacon, why can't priests marry, and had he ever shaved his mustache. I added some of the color commentary about our personal story. We all laughed together and delighted in just being there. Then one boy asked if demons were real. Richard handled the question truthfully. Another hand went up. Can they possess people? The youth director stepped in to assure them that we needed to focus on Christ, not become curiosity seekers about evil.

Usually I would defer to her leadership, but something prompted me, and recalling my goal, I pursued the topic. I shared how I taught my own children about the dangers of the occult and explained to them how evil uses tarot cards, Ouija boards, or psychics. One girl asked, "How do you know if someone in possessed?" And so, the conversation continued.

Afterwards, one young lady came up and admitted that she and a friend had been playing with a Ouija board and something happened. She told her story which she was afraid no one would believe. Richard offered advice. I was astounded that the Holy Spirit needed to talk to this girl and shook us out of bed to do it. Later, as we were saying our goodbye's, one of the adult leaders came up and tearfully told us about her son who was struggling with addiction. Richard and I were able to pray with her and point her toward support. Again... God is good, all the time.

There have been other promptings, and I'm grateful the Lord sees fit to give me chances to continue to practice. Even though I may not have always known what to say or do, I said something about my walk and my Lord. Although I've not been perfect, but there is improvement. Most importantly, I've learned that I don't regret saying the wrong thing as much as I regret not saying anything at all.


