De Colores!

In February of this year I fulfilled a longstanding bucket list item by making a Pilgrimage to the Holy Land. The experience exceeded even my very high expectations. After an incredible two weeks, I returned home just as COVID-19 was being recognized as a serious threat to our country. God was certainly with me. I arrived safe and healthy and have remained so.

Spiritually fulfilled by my pilgrimage in the Holy Land, which is often called the fifth Gospel, I was prepared to have my best Lent and Easter ever. This was my best, but it was much different than I anticipated. Since my wife and I are caretakers in our home for her 99-year-old mother, we must be very cautious about exposing her to the virus. I felt compelled to withdraw from my diaconal ministries for a time to minimize the risk.

As a result, I did not function as a deacon during Lent and Easter. For the first time in 32 years, I did not process the Paschal candle into a darkened Church at the Easter Vigil and chant the Exsultet, the beautiful Easter Proclamation.

I am sure each of us can list hundreds of things that we have missed during this quarantine. We look back wistfully at our pre-COVID lives and wonder when or if treasured activities will return. The degree to which the virus is controlling many aspects of our lives is something we could never have imagined.

We like to be in control, and the degree to which we try to control our lives often keeps us from trusting God. "Let go and let God" is a phrase I learned in my Cursillo in May of 1977. Even as we ponder the age old question "How can God allow this to happen?" we must keep our situation in perspective.

The virus is powerful and not fully understood by scientists and the medical community, but it does not control the most important aspects of our lives. The virus

cannot take away our faith. Our faith may be challenged, but what we believed to be true three months ago remains true today.

John 3:16: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life."

The virus cannot change our relationships. We may need to find different ways of expressing our love and affection for one another, but we will still love. We love because God loves us. As we reflect on the crucifixion of Christ, it is important that we recognize that this was an act of love. Jesus, as God, could have come down from the cross at any moment. What held Jesus on the cross was not the nails. It was His love for us.

The virus cannot destroy the Resurrection, and so it cannot take away our hope. We are Easter people! The Resurrection is central to who we are as Catholic Christians. We know that Jesus, who rose from the dead is with us in every place and every situation. His Spirit was sent to us on Pentecost, which we just celebrated.

I find it helpful to reflect on the Emmaus story. The two disciples were distraught. They must have been wondering if the last three years with Jesus had been a waste of time. Afraid and disoriented they were leaving Jerusalem. On that road Jesus encountered them. He opened their eyes and restored their faith and hope.

Jesus is waiting to do that for us today. He is always walking with us, even when we, like those disciples, are walking in the wrong direction. He is at this moment asking us to trust Him and to deepen our relationship with Him. Let us not miss this opportunity to let go and let God.

Until we can share a Cursillo experience together again, my prayer is that each of us will have a happy and healthy 4th Day!

I hope that this message finds you all physically and spiritually healthy and well. These certainly are strange and challenging times. I won't go over all of the troubles of the world, we hear of them enough already and are all too familiar with them. Our Lent and Easter seasons have been filled with fear, and now the emotional climate has turned to anger, division and civil unrest. As we wonder how we are going to come out of all of this I'm reminded of a lyric from the 1974 song; Peace, Love and Understanding by Nick Lowe, and later recorded by Elvis Costello. In it the author asks the questions "Where are the strong? And who are the trusted? And where is the harmony? Sweet Harmony."

We've just celebrated the great feast of Pentecost, and we heard the story of how the disciples had subjected themselves to self-isolation out of fear, until the Holy Spirit came upon them and they were enflamed with courage to boldly go out and change the world. The women's team in Flagstaff who had their weekend postponed in March have stayed in formation and are looking forward to getting the go ahead to

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reschedule their weekend as soon as possible. We are still planning on having Men's and Women's weekends in October and November here in Phoenix. The Spring Men's Core team has stayed together and both the Men and Women will be putting their teams together to start formal formation soon. Please pray for all of the team members and consider giving your yes if you are called on to volunteer to work a team. We will also hold a Sponsor Workshop at Mount Claret on August 22nd.

Together we call on the Holy Spirit to lead us with the power of prayer, enkindle our hearts with Love for God and for our brothers and sisters, and guide us to carry on His mission with sound judgment for the safety and benefit of all.

PIETY, STUDY, AND ACTION

After my Cursillo, I came down the mountain reflecting on the people I met, the promises I made to myself and God; the promise to be a faithful child of God. From all my experiences of my weekend I continue to reflect on the "Come, Holy Spirit" prayer especially the line, "Enkindle in us the fire of your love. Send forth Your Spirit and we shall be created, and You shall renew the face of the earth." As we have experienced the Easter miracle, and celebrated Pentecost, we are reminded of the fire of the Holy Spirit dwelling in us. For me, the pillars of the Cursillo, Piety, Study and Action, are truly the sparks to enkindle the fire of the Holy Spirit and to accept the mission to change the world.

Now the task of changing the world can be a little larger than our sphere of influence. To be that influence or the light in the darkness, we can feel scared, and

overwhelmed. But God knows you better than you know yourself.

We are all given three forms of vocations in our life to influence the world. The first is the realization God perfectly created us all to be unrepeatable in our creation, and He created each of us for this specific time in history. I realize my first vocation is to be a child of God: to know him to love him and to serve him. The second is our state in life; are we called to be priests, religious, married, parents, single? Are we willing to accept

where we are and live it to the fullest in glorifying Him? Finally, we are created in our professions to value the sanctification of work and demonstrate the humility of being an honest worker.

Living and accepting our vocations is not easy. I struggle with the anxieties of parenting, and being a good husband. I struggle with going to work in the career God lead me to as a police officer. Honestly, I don't always do flips and somersaults when the alarm rings in the

morning. Our Lord knows it's hard and He sent the Holy Spirit to guide us in life. The answer to loving my family to the fullest is accepting my role as a leader and as a father; having those difficult talks with my daughter, helping with chores, saying sorry to my wife. These hard things are done through the Holy Spirit leading me to emulate Christ the servant - knowing that service to my wife and daughter is on the narrow path, picking them up daily as my crosses and carrying them all the way to Calvary.

In my profession I am not always greeted with a warm welcome, and it can be a frustration; showing up to help only to be ridiculed. It is those times I have to call on the Holy Spirit to listen to Christ's words reminding me to be the peacemaker and not defending my pride.

In my desire to follow Him there is great suffering. I

will be uncomfortable, true love is not always pleasure. There is a lot of personal suffering. Our Lord knows this and as He was in the desert for forty days, He was tempted and physically weak from thirst and hunger. He knew His mission, and He loves us so much He resisted the needs of the flesh and the temptations of the Devil himself! St. Peter writes, "For to this you have been called, because Christ suffered for you leaving you an example that you

should follow in his footsteps." (1 Peter, 2:21)

It is in these times of uncertainty, and self-doubt we call on the Holy Spirit, "Come and enkindle the fire of Your love." We call on the Spirit to guide us to grow stronger, to be motivated by love of Him, our families, and our neighbors; to evaluate how are we glorifying Him through our vocations so we can do His will for each of us: to be holy and renew the face of the earth.

• WHAT IS IT?

Claret remains our home for future candidates and all Cursillistas.


