"Therefore, that I might not become too elated, a thorn in the flesh was given to me, an angel of Satan, to beat me, to keep me from being too elated. Three times I begged the Lord about this, that it might leave me, but He said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." I will rather boast most gladly of my weaknesses, in order that the power of Christ may dwell with me. Therefore, I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and constraints, for the sake of Christ; for when I am weak, then I am strong."

2 Cor. 12:7-10

"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

My repeated failures with Lenten resolutions have brought that line home to me. Now I believe that my "failures" over time came to be a great grace for me and I believe I am in good company: St. Paul had his failures; his "thorn in the flesh."

He writes how he begged the Lord to be healed of it and the Lord answered "My grace is all you need, for My power is greatest when you are weak." I invite you to read 2 Cor 12:7-10. Those verses have been a great comfort to me.

So now I continue to make a couple of resolutions; simple ones: Read the scriptures of the day and let them speak to me. Pray for the gift I need the most. Spend a few minutes each evening looking back over the day. It's the intent that counts. May Lent be time of great grace for all of us.

#### FROM THE LAY DIRECTOR

#### Into The Desert!

Lent is upon us and it is one of my favorite seasons of the year. To some, that may seem a little odd. Isn't Lent after all, a time of sacrifice and self-denial? The concept is completely countercultural in these times when we've come to expect instant gratification at our fingertips. In these times when we want it all and we want it now, what could possibly motivate us to give up anything? Perhaps the Gospel can shed some light on this. Luke tells us that after His baptism in the Jordan: "Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert for forty days, to be tempted by the devil." Our Lenten experience is an opportunity for each of us to be imitators of Christ and make room in our cluttered hearts, minds and lives, so that we too can be filled with the Holy Spirit and find the strength to face down our temptations. Like Christ, we too have a mission as a result of our baptism. We shouldn't be glum about prayer, fasting and alms giving, knowing that we are training ourselves for something as wonderful as serving the Lord.

In his Apostolic Exhortation "The Joy of the Gospel" Pope Francis says that "There are Christians whose lives seem like Lent without Easter." As an RCIA instructor for the past several years, I always look forward to Lent because my Catechumens are in the home stretch to becoming fully immersed as Catholics and there is an excitement in the air leading up to the joy of the Easter vigil. In some ways the Cursillo weekend is much like a mini Lent. Just as on the first day of the weekend we come to know ourselves and to

know Christ, the Scrutiny readings during Lent remind us that we are sinners and that we have personal work to do, but more importantly, they remind us that we are infinitely loved by a merciful God. As our Cursillo progresses toward the Clausura on Sunday, when we go forth to love and serve the Lord, so Lent moves us toward Easter when, like the disciples of Emmaus, we will walk along



the road of our fourth day accompanied by the Risen Christ.

As we follow Jesus into the desert, I'd like to share with each of you some sound spiritual advice that I received from Bishop Nevares when I spoke to him last week to congratulate him and thank him for accepting the invitation to serve as the National Episcopal Advisor for the Cursillo Movement in the United States. Our beloved Bishop gave three words of advice: "Pray, Pray, Pray!" So this season please pray for the Cursillo Movement. Pray for the teams in formation for the Spring Cursillo weekends. And pray for the candidates considering attending the upcoming weekends and joining this wonderful community. Rest assured that I will be praying for all of you.

My mother sang in the choir and my father taught an adult class for as long as I remember.

Like every young student we received a Bible from the church in our early teens. I was very intrigued by the Bible and I felt very important having one of my own. I always remember my father reading the Bible and studying it. I frequently asked him about where in the Bible I could find the stories I heard in Sunday School. "being deeper." I never thought about myself as a deep person.

bed and to finish before my sixteenth birthday. He told me I would discover all the stories I had heard about, plus so many others. Little did I know, he had set the foundation of my religious life for the rest of my life.

After my wife Sharon and I married, I studied about the Catholic Church under the guidance of Fr. Michael Diskin at St. Louis the King for over a year and I was confirmed in the Catholic Church. My wife Sharon and I became a members of St. Helen Parish, in Glendale in 1979. I later started teaching High School RE classes in the Church and this helped me (or maybe even forced me a little) to continue my study.

I continue my father's challenge to read The Word daily. I can count on one hand the times I have missed since that day my Dad first challenged me. The more I study, and the more I explore the Catholic faith, the deeper my relationship with Jesus Christ grows, and it is sometimes just amazing to me when others around me can see His reflection in me. To be the face of Christ to others is the most inviting way we can share our love and faith.

Study is an important facet in the life of a Cursillista and study tools are a great way to grow. Aside from my bible, I am currently committed to two publications to lead and encourage me on my journey: Living Faith Daily Catholic Devotions and

The Word Among Us, Daily Meditations for Catholics.


