As we celebrate the end of October and the beginning of November, we are reminded of those special people – those saints – who have gone before us. We celebrate All Hallows Eve (Halloween), the Feast of All Saints, and the Feast of All Souls. We remember in a special way those men and women who the Church recognizes as Saints (capital “S”). But we also remember all the saints (little “S”) who have not been canonized but are saints to each of us – our Grandparents, Parents, Relatives, Friends, Spiritual Benefactors, and, in some cases, Children who have gone before us and who share the Eternal Banquet in Heaven with the Lord. It’s good we celebrate this wonderful communion of saints – it’s part of what we believe, it’s part of our experience as Catholic Christians, and it’s where we ultimately hope one day to be...!!

We are reminded in the *Layperson in the Church* rollo that **we are called to be saints**, living a life of grace, captivated by the Holy Spirit, and stepping into our identity as children of God, brothers and sisters of Christ, and temples of the Holy Spirit. Being a saint is what we are called to be by our Baptism. We are also called to live the mission of Jesus – to be his hands, his feet, his voice, his embrace in a world that so desperately needs to feel Christ’s presence. And we do so because we recognize that, even though called to be a saint, we are just a sinner who is in need of God’s mercy like everyone else.

Thomas Merton, the Trappist Monk and great spiritual writer, said: *“A man becomes a saint not by the conviction that he is better than sinners but by the*

*realization that he is one of them, and that all [together] need the mercy of God.”*

As we just heard in our recent Gospel from Luke, that is why the Tax Collector went home justified from the Temple after praying – since he simply asked for God’s mercy, God’s healing grace. The Pharisee, who was so full of himself, went home not justified since there was nothing God could do in his life – he, the Pharisee, pridefully took credit for everything.

To be a saint means we empty ourselves of those things that stand in the way of our relationship with God, and we ask him to fill us with his grace, his love, his mercy and compassion – transforming us in the process so we truly CAN become saints. We recognize that it is only through HIM that we can become the saints he calls us to be.

May you become the saint God is calling you to be. Happy Feast Day....!!



## FROM THE LAY DIRECTOR

Dear Friends,

Saint Paul has a wonderful way of addressing his friends in his first letter to the Corinthians; “To those sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints together”. What a wonderful greeting for us Catholic Christians as we bring in the month of November with the feasts of All Saints and All Souls, reminding us that we in the pilgrim Church are accompanied by the communion of saints,



who have preceded us in holiness, as well as the souls of the faithful departed who continue their journey to Christ during their purification in Purgatory. Paul’s greeting also reminds us that we have a calling.

This evening I was blessed to teach an RCIA class on the Eucharist, and one of the scripture passages that we reflected on was from the Last Supper Discourse in John’s gospel, chapter 15, when Jesus says “I no longer call you slaves,... I have called you friends”. On the surface, this might seem like an unusual phrase, but if we look a little closer we can see that it is a marvelous revelation about Holy Communion.


For the Hebrew people the term slave or servant was not necessarily one of shame or lowliness, but of a high calling. Great figures of the Old Testament such as Moses, Joshua and David often refer to themselves as a “Slave” or “Servant” of the Lord. In the New Testament epistles Saint Paul considers it an honor that he is “Called to be a Slave for Christ Jesus.” But Christ elevates us to another level when He calls us His friends. Friendship implies a relationship built on trust and love. In the Eucharist we are entering into an intimate, personal relationship as we come into union with the body, blood, soul and divinity of our Lord and our God. The amazing reality is that God has sought us out to be in this relationship as Jesus states; “It is not you who chose me, but I who chose you, and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will remain.”

As I write this, my lovely bride Angela and I have each been chosen to serve as Rector and Rectora of the upcoming January Cursillo weekends. Please lift up with your Palanca all our fellow Cursillistas, who are offering up their time and talents to bring others

to Christ by serving on the teams that are now beginning formation.

In a special way, Cursillo inspires each of us to know, love and serve the Lord, and the order of these three actions is very relevant. The more that we know the Lord, the more that we love Him. And the more that we love Him, the more we desire to serve Him. It is Faith in the love of God that causes ordinary persons to become saints. In the end, it is all about our relationship, our friendship with Christ. It is this friendship that moves us to live out the commandment that Jesus gives us in the same passage of John’s gospel to “Love one another, as I have loved you.” In these times when relationships with Jesus in the Eucharist continue to fade among Catholics, what greater gift could you give to your friends, than to bring them to Christ by inviting them into an intimate friendship with Jesus through Cursillo? Thank you to all of you who out of love, serve the Lord with gladness. My favorite Bob Dylan song says “You’ve got to serve somebody,” and Saint Paul in his letter to the Romans tells us that “The love of God has been poured out into our hearts.” With this in mind I can joyfully say that “As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord.”

This is Cheryl Sprinzl, and I made my Cursillo in 2005, #726. I want to share with you the last twelve months of my study, piety, and action.

After being laid off from the job I had held for over 25 years in June of 2018, I was devastated and unsure as to where I was supposed to go, let alone why this had happened. I had to consciously remind myself every day that God was in charge, and He alone knew the reason. I prayed for greater faith and trust as the days turned into months of unemployment.



In October of 2018 I was again employed. With this new job there were so many changes from what I had known – even the process of finding a job had changed as the last time I had interviewed was 1993! Yet, God was present - the person who read my resume saw the company I had worked for, and it turned out her mother and I had been co-workers for years. Once she had spoken to her mother, I was given an interview and hired! My “action” has been going through the office each morning and greeting each person using their first name, inquiring how they are doing, building relationships of friendship.

I realized that now that I could make morning Mass at St. Mary’s in Chandler with Marty before heading into work. This was something I had always wished I could do, but in my

former employment, it was impossible. It’s difficult to put into words the difference in my day when I start it with morning Mass – I am filled with peace of heart and mind that together, He and I can make it a really great day! With attending daily Mass, I am able to study the readings and Gospel more. I feel more in tune with what God is asking of me as his daughter.

Recently Marty and I made the 33 Day Consecration to Jesus through Mary for the second time, and we delved deeper into it, thus finding another level of relationship and trust of our Blessed Mother, and how she can bring us closer to her Son. Towards the finish of the 33 days, I felt moved to really work on my humility and obedience and with that, I started to wear a veil to Mass and Adoration. I do this to humble myself before God, as He is truly present in the Eucharist. I have found that wearing it also keeps me focused on what is in front of me, versus what might be happening around me, the small distractions.

It’s been almost a year now in my new job, and I am starting to see the fruits of the last twelve months: a much closer relationship with Jesus Christ and his Immaculate Mother, more time spent in prayer and thanksgiving, as well as a deeper understanding of my Catholic faith. I would have to say: God is GOOD!

**CURSILLO SAINT TO BE...**

**SERVANT OF GOD, EDUARDO BONNÍN**

On February 15, 2015, The Chancellor of the Diocese of Mallorca, Spain, read the written petition as the first step toward the beatification of the founder of the Cursillo Movement, Eduardo Bonnín Aguilo. The petition was presented by the Cursillo Secretariat of the Diocese of Mallorca, and was solicited by the national Secretariats of Italy, Portugal, and El Salvador. Bonnín can now be called Servant of God, and we can pray for his intercession. Any miracles which occur as the result of his intercession can be submitted to the postulator, Father Gabriel Ramis, at Feba-usa.org, as a possible step toward the cause of beatification or canonization of Eduardo Bonnín.

**Vatican approved prayer for intercession**

*“Oh God, the dispenser of all graces and charisms, You granted your servant Eduardo Bonnín Aguilo the grace of dedicating his whole life with humility and generosity, to the work of the Cursillos in Christianity Movement, as he traveled the five continents proclaiming that God in Christ loves us. Grant us through his intercession the favor that we now implore Thee. (Name favor being requested.) Also grant us the grace, of his beatification for your greater glory and the good of your Church, that shines throughout the lives of its saints. We beg this of you in the Name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.” (At the end pray the Lord’s Prayer.)*



**EASY TITHE**

McMahon, and the love, time, and talent of many Cursillistas over the years. Support through Easy Tithe assists in ensuring that Mt. Claret remains our home for future candidates and all Cursillistas.


