



Greetings Sisters and Brothers in Christ.

I hope that you are all doing well. I was blessed this week to see the new movie Fatima, the story of the Blessed Mother's appearance to three peasant children in Portugal from May to October 1917. One of the aspects of the film that impressed me the most was the young Lucia's resilience, strengthened by the faith gained in her relationship with Our Lady, to proclaim the Truth despite

seemingly overwhelming pressure to deny it by those more powerful in the culture.

In many ways the story mirrors much of what is happening in our world today. The Mayor, a so-called progressive politician, interrogates the children in an effort to paint religion as harmful superstition, and in August of that year he actually imprisoned the children to keep them from their monthly meeting with Our Lady. Church officials and even Lucia's



It occurs to me that this is exactly what Church is, from the Greek and Latin "Ecclesia", the gathering together of God's people who have been called out. These past few months, due to circumstances beyond our control, much like Lucia, we too have found ourselves in a situation where we can't go into the Church building as we are accustomed to, and have had to encounter the Church in unexpected places, such as on our computer and television screens.

Although all of the messages given by Our Lady of Fatima cannot be fully explained in a short movie, the

instruction that she gives to Lucia, Jacinta and Francisco reminded me of the method that we encounter in Cursillo. The first lesson given is one of Piety, she tells them that they must pray the Rosary daily for peace in the world. It's no coincidence that Fatima the movie was released on the feast day of Saint Augustine, who is often depicted in art with a burning heart in his hand. Through pious prayer we build our relationship with God so that our own

restless hearts soon are inflamed with the desire to know and do His will. In these trying times we must continue to offer our Palanca prayers for one another.


The second instruction that Our Lady gives is that it is very important that the children learn to read and write. Study is an integral part of our development in faith, and is especially critical to the discernment of Truth in these times when we are bombarded with conflicting accounts of nearly everything that happens in our society. Saint Paul addresses this in the second reading for the 22<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary time from his letter to the Romans, 12:2: "Do not conform yourselves to this age but be transformed by the

renewal of your mind, that you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect." On August 22<sup>nd</sup> we had a wonderful experience as approximately 25 Cursillistas gathered to learn more about our Faith and our movement in our first ever virtual Cursillo School of Leaders. Please look for the Zoom invitation coming soon in your email or on the Phoenix Cursillo website for the next School of Leaders held on the third Saturday of the month.

A striking scene of the Fatima movie is when the children ask the Blessed Mother if they can go with her to Heaven. Indeed, the youngest of the children, Saints Francisco and Jacinta Marto, would join her in heaven

within two years, ironically as victims of the Spanish Flu pandemic of 1918. But Lucia Santos is told that she must remain here, because she has been given a mission of Apostolic Action, to share the message of Our Lady of the Rosary for the conversion of the world from the life of sin that threatens it. In a recent address Sister Dierdre Byrne, a

Sister Dierdre Byrne, a Consecrated Nun and Physician made a great statement that captures our mission as Catholic Christians. Sister

Dede stated: "As a physician, I can say without hesitation: Life begins at conception. While what I have to say may be difficult for some to hear, I am saying it because I am not just pro-life, I am pro-eternal life. I want all of us to end up in heaven together someday."

For the vulnerable among us, especially pre-born children, elderly, immigrants, unemployed and the poor.


For the restoration of one nation, under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.

Art was a quiet man who shared his faith with all he met by wearing the face of Christ in everything he did. 
Steve Bushard (#312) a member of St. Thomas the
